## The Film Portfolio (Portfolio Pages & Film Reel) is due by 10:10am on Wednesday, April 17. Again, here's the IB assessment page for the Film Portfolio.

While there is no leeway for turning it in late\*, for extra incentive, you will earn a 10/10 for the "March Film Journal – One Pager" when you turn this in on the due date, by the correct time. This was not an assignment you had to complete -- but can earn the 10 pts in the projects category nonetheless.

Your Film Portfolio is made up of two parts: 1) Portfolio Pages and 2) a Film Reel

## 1) Portfolio Pages

- a. Include a table of contents as your 1st page (example right) & end with a works cited page.
- b. Your name should NOT appear on the portfolio pages.
- c. Contents:
  - i. 3 pages per role -- with 3rd role relating to a complete (<3 minute) film
  - ii. Pages are a balance between text and images
  - iii. Begin the three main sections with the role and subheadings noting film title/s (or assignment title if it wasn't a full film) of your clip/s.
  - iv. Remember, this is NOT a journal entry (no dates, weekly reflections, etc.); here are some ideas from the how-to links above...
    - What were your intentions/ideas behind making the film?
    - Explain your approaches to making the film and other pre-production work.
    - What did you specifically do during the filming process? Highlight challenges you overcame.
    - What did you do post-production to help with your vision/story?
    - Reflection on the process/ specifics regarding collaboration...
    - Here are ideas for what roles did at all production phases
    - Also add things like: What films you've watched, discussed, analyzed... that you relate to?
    - Why did this role excite and inspire you? (even if it didn't try to add enthusiasm here!)

## 2) Film Reel

- a. While the Film Portfolio Film Reel is submitted as one file, it is made up of three Reels one "reel" for each role.
- b. Each Reel begins with a black slate (10 seconds), see example  $\rightarrow$ 
  - i. "placed before each of the three film production roles in order to identify each clip of evidence submitted per role and the length of each clip."
  - ii. Each black slate will have title listing the role, the clip, title of clip, duration of clip
- c. Each Reel contains 1 6 clips of evidence.
  - i. Choose your best evidence from experiments, completed films or excerpts from films
  - ii. Recommended minimum length of at least 30 seconds per clip
  - iii. Your third Reel is from your third role which contains just one clip a complete film.
  - iv. Remember: the completed film should not include any credits.
- d. Each Reel is 3 minutes maximum (excluding the black slate).
- e. NO annotations or descriptions of the work should be imposed onto the footage.

*Note:* You will submit both parts electronically.

- → For the Portfolio Pages, attach the document or include a Google Doc link and send via email.
- → For the Film Reel, the maximum file size is 500 MB, if your file size is bigger, I can fix that before submission but you will need to be sure you can get me the file; you can do this by placing it on the public server or getting me a Google or YouTube link.
