

March Film Presentation for **Non-Testers**

- 1) **Create a ONE PAGE document** beginning with this:
 - a) A title (the name of your March Film) with your role.
 - b) And these four section headings: **Pre-Production, Production, Post-Production, & Advice**

- 2) In EACH of the production phase sections (Pre-Production, Production, Post-Production):
 - a) Include **one or two of your images** from your daily journal that documented your progress for the March Film.
 - This is a one page document, most of your will need to shrink your images
 - b) **Add commentary** that goes along with the images and **explains your role in the particular production phase**.
 - For some, this may be your captions, but if your captions do not explain your role and/or the production phase, please create the commentary for this.

So in this section, you are copying & pasting info & images you already have, fitting them into the different phases of production; if you need help connecting your role to the different phases of production, [this document may be helpful](#) (look for your role beginning on page 2).

- 3) **Advice**
 - a) End the one-pager w/ a statement of advice from your role's point of view (what's good/hard/fun/difficult/etc. about the production role)
 - b) These will be displayed to show off the different, varied, and complex roles of producing a film.
 - compliment or critique the process/your group members, but don't name names, just roles

- 4) Do NOT put your name on the sheet; only put the name of your movie & your role, at the top.

- 5) Due: I expect that you will complete this in class, but if not, it is due by midnight tonight, 4/5.
 - **email me the document/link**
 - if you are absent on 4/5, you have an extra day and this is due by midnight, Monday April 15.

Scoring: This is a "Project" grade – it is the summary of your March Production from your particular role.

- 10 points total: 5 for presentation (organized/looks like a formal presentation, following directions)
 5 for content (speak to your role in all the production phases)
