

IB Film Testers: November Film Portfolio Work

Again, go to [this IB Film Portfolio summary presentation](#) that describes what goes into the Film Portfolio.

Look at page 3 for the role you are taking on for this production.

Read the “Responsibilities,” “Possible Tasks,” and “Evidence” pages for your role.

Note that the “Evidence” bullet points are just spelling out how you can document the “Possible Tasks”... except for the reflection column – that one doesn’t reiterate the specifics, you need to go back to “Possible Tasks” page.

You may also want to look again at the [IB Guide regarding the Film Portfolio](#).

Your job for the current film:

1. Add a section to the Film Portfolio document (the document you shared with me for your last film)
 - section title should be your current production role
 - needs to be a role you did not have last film production
 - you may be the screenwriter, but you would need to take on another role too (see me if this is the case)
2. DAILY add evidence to the document of your role.
 - evidence can be descriptions and commentary
 - evidence can be research (at least one entry of research* is required for this production)
 - evidence can be an image (with caption)
 - a variety of the above would be good
 - look at the [IB Film Portfolio summary](#) for ideas
3. You are compiling the evidence daily, but I will be checking and grading your entries on these days:
 - Nov. 10 (two entries total)
 - Nov. 17 (three new entries, 5 entries total)
 - Nov. 24 (one new entry, 6 entries total)
 - Nov. 27 (one new entry, 7 entries total)

**Research your production role in a specific movie/s... think of a favorite movie, find and read information about your role in the movie production. (Suggestion: think of a movie where your role is a stand-out; ie: if you are an editor, look at movies that won awards for editing... - look for interviews, videos, first-hand accounts, professional articles (NOT fan-based info or IMDB, etc. – and include citations (a link is fine)). Remember, you are required to have at least one cited academic/professional article.*
