

## Film History Timeline

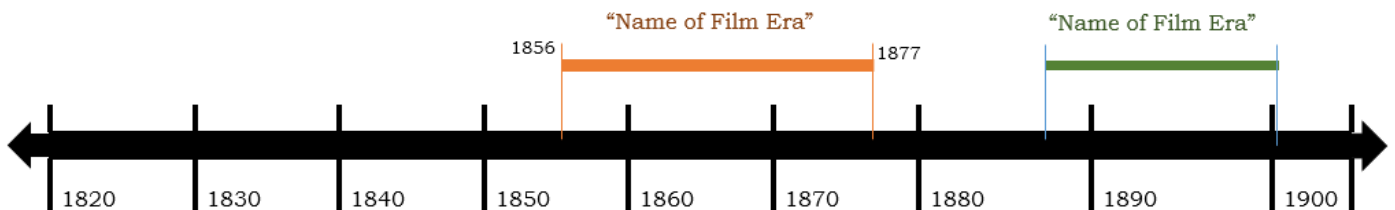
With your partner, create a visually appealing and organized timeline of film history.

Using your summer assignment notes and the provided timelines, add **film eras** and specific **film facts** in a readable and thoughtful way. If neither of your handwriting is exceptionally neat (or if you prefer), print your era titles/facts and paste them on your timeline (do not print more images, just use the ones you already have).

### I. Film Eras

- The Silent Era (*mid-1890s to late 1920s*)
- German Expressionism (*1919-1933*)
- French Avant-Garde (*1918-1930*)
- Soviet Montage (*1924-1935*)
- Hollywood's Golden Age (*1927-47*)
- Italian Neorealism (*1942-1952*)
- Film Noir (*1940s-1960s*)
- Japan's Golden Age of Cinema (*1950s*)
- French New Wave (*1959-1964*)
- New Hollywood Cinema (*mid 1960s to early 1980s*)
- Hong Kong New Wave (*late 1980s to early 1990s*)
- Nuevo Cine Mexicano (*1990s*)
- New Bollywood (*1990s-present*)

Film Era Requirements: 1) Specific name of era and 2) accurate marker for length of era. You may add exact/general dates, but not required. In addition, for visual clarity, do not color all of your film eras the same color – use a variety of colors. See below...

- 9 movie titles
- Both of your favorite movies (with date of release)
- The last movie you each saw in the theater (**do NOT add the first movie you saw in the theater, you'll be doing something else with this**).

You've already decided 6 of your 9 needed facts for #1-3 → Add the images you printed to the appropriate places on your timeline and label according to the *Include* below. Next, decided three more important facts for each category together and add them (without images) to the timeline. And lastly, add your images for #4 & #5 (labeling according to *Include* below).
