

Suggestions for choosing your Oral Presentation scene...

**Do you remember a scene?**

- choose that one, it resonated with you somehow
- were you confused by a scene? - choose that one, you already have a starting investigation point

**Look to see what clips may be readily available on YouTube, etc.**

- this is especially if you don't own the movie but also...
- these are scenes that for whatever reason, people have felt compelled to post

**Look to see what scenes people in the film industry, film academics, and the like have spoken about** (*not reviewers, but other directors, cinematographers, sound designers, producers, etc.*)

- this means that you, as someone that knows what they are talking about, will most likely also find the scene analysis worthy

**Remember, the scene needs to be no more than 5 minutes and you must choose the scene by Monday, and have access to it before class begins on Tuesday.**

*If the scene is not readily available online and you don't own it, if you give me the specifics and ask me before the end of the day on Monday, I can most likely get you a copy of it.*
