

## Foreign Film Assignment

Before November 30, **watch or re-watch a foreign film.** Follow these steps:

1) First, read through highlighted parts in this [IB Film Clarification document](#).

*This is a document that clarifies what is required for the IB Film Independent Study\**

2) Choose a **foreign film to watch** (anything non-American) that would potentially be a good film to analyze/compare/etc. Do not worry too much about the assignment itself at this point, you read the clarification document just to get you thinking, just choose a good film.

Note: Watching a film is a required assignment, not just a “watch movies” suggestion. If you don’t watch foreign films much, take a look at some of these must-see/suggested foreign films ([A](#) [B](#) [C](#)), or ask friends/family for suggestions (I’d be more than happy to suggest movies too – ask!), or browse Netflix/Amazon by foreign films... and feel free to watch with friends and/or family, make it a group effort©  
*And if you are watching the film and don’t like it, choose another. There are so many awesome films out there – don’t waste your time with something that you don’t care for.*

3) **Once you have watched the film,** [please indicate the name of the movie here](#).

4) Again, this is due before class begins on Thursday, November 30.
